Is this program right for you?

MNGOT is designed for individuals who have a **Bachelor's degree** and are **currently employed in an ISD 622 school** in one of the following positions, including:

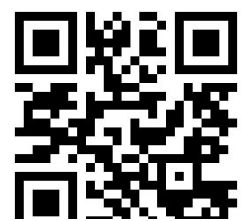
- **Paraprofessionals**
- **Substitute teachers** who hold only a substitute teaching license
- Teachers with a **district waiver** who *do not* have another US teaching license
- Other **non-licensed** district positions

Advantages of MNGOT

- A teacher community (cohort)
- Summer classes are in-person; school year classes are hybrid (online & in-person)
- Possibility of continuing to work until student teaching semester
- Practicing Tier 2 teachers may be able to complete the program while continuing to teach
- Possibility of paid student teaching if funding allows
- Innovative, equity-driven curriculum with University mentoring

Schedule (year two determined by district situation)

Year One	Year Two
Non-licensed district staff work full-time and complete 100 hours of field work; mentored and evaluated by university supervisor; complete 18 credits	Employee leaves role and becomes a full-time teacher candidate (with a paid stipend*) and co-teaches for the full year; mentored and evaluated by university supervisor; complete 18 credits OR
	Employee works full time and takes a leave of absence for 16 weeks of student teaching; mentored and evaluated by university supervisor; complete 18 credits OR
	Employee is hired as a teacher of record on a Tier I or Tier II license; mentored and evaluated by university supervisor; complete 18 credits
Teachers of record on waiver work full-time; mentored and evaluated by university supervisor; complete 18 credits	Teachers of record on waiver work full-time; mentored and evaluated by university supervisor; complete 18 credits

Tuition and Financial Aid Information

We are able to offer a reduced rate of \$600 per credit. The 36-credit program will save participants nearly \$3,000 compared to traditional pathways. In addition, working is allowable during at least the first year of the program, depending on individual student teaching scenarios and district employment opportunities.
