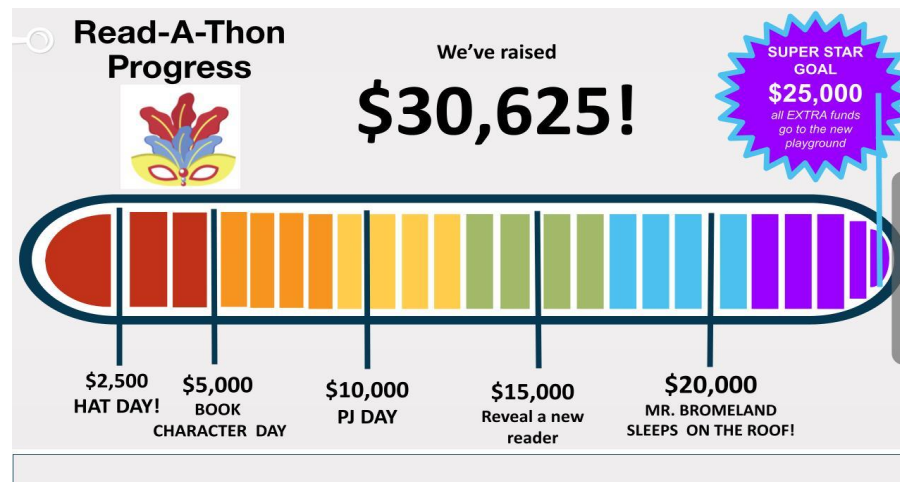

End of Year Device Return

All devices/computers used by students throughout the year must be returned to the school. If your student is attending school in person, they will leave their computer, charger, and case with their classroom teacher on the last day of school, Thursday June 3rd..

If your student is in distance learning, please return their computer and charger on Friday, June 4th between 8:00 am and 5:00 pm, and Monday, June 7 between 8:00 am and 5:00 pm. If neither of these times works for you, please call us to schedule a time.

All devices must be returned no later than Tuesday, June 8th.

A Note From the Health Office Regarding Medication Pick Up

All medication from the Health Office must be picked up by 3:15 pm on Thursday, June 3rd. Medication **MUST** be picked up by a parent. Students are not allowed to take their medication home, except for epi-pens, inhalers, or diabetic supplies. These items may be sent home with written parent consent.
